With recent studies showing that Skagit County children who are entering kindergarten are behind when compared with neighboring counties, our current bold goal is that by 2025, all Skagit children entering kindergarten are ready to learn.

Aside from helping raise funds for and supporting other nonprofits in the county, and even though COVID has slowed down some programing, United Way of Skagit County is still providing a plethora of programs. A few of these include Welcome Baby, a program that creates a bridge to connect parents to other

services in our community with its resource referral knowledge, as well as its parent support program; We're Reading, where we work with partners such as United General District 304 WIC, and Skagit Reads, to work together to share information with parents and caregivers about the importance of early literacy

paired with easy at home activities; The Financial PEOPLE Project (FPP), where the PEOPLE stands for, "Peers Empowering Others by Providing Leadership and Education", which is project born out of the Skagit Asset Building Coalition that was then spearheaded by the United Way of Skagit County, where for six consecutive weeks staff from local banks and credit unions present FDIC Money Smart lessons to students, and session participants learn about: budgeting and debt reduction, loans, saving for retirement and education, credit scores and credit repair, bank services and checking accounts.




2020-21 Financial Snapshot
